► **GOFUNDME PAGE FOR SAXON LUTHERAN MEMORIAL** The history behind this memorial is in 1839 some of the Saxon Germans coming from Saxony, Germany located here and elsewhere in East Perry County, Missouri. On the evening of Sunday, March 30, a storm came through Frohna, Missouri and lightning



struck a tree near the visitors center of the Saxon Lutheran Memorial, catching the tree and the center on fire. Thankfully, no one was there at the time. The center was completely destroyed and all of the historical artifacts inside are also gone. By the time the local emergency response firefighters arrived it was totally engulfed in flames.
