

On Maundy Thursday "The Living Last Supper" will once again be presented here at Peace. The pose from Leonardo da Vinci's famous painting, "The Last Supper," will be recreated and one by one each disciple "comes to life" to share his thoughts and wonder if he will be the one to betray our Lord. The Chancel Choir adds to the drama with various musical selections and the service culminates with the celebration of Holy Communion.



SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

ROOTED IN CHRIST



Greetings again to our Sunday School parents and fellow parishioners at Peace.

January was a bit cold and snowy to say the least. In fact, as our Sunday School parents know very well, we had to cancel classes for one weekend, due to inclement weather.

In February, we will be wrapping up the Winter curriculum. The Parents and Me Class will continue with teaching God's Word to our youngest students. Preschool and Kindergarten students will learn about the Wedding at Cana, the Transfiguration of Jesus, the rejection of Jesus at Nazareth, and the clearing of the Temple by Jesus. The 1st and 2nd grade students will read about Jesus changing water into wine, the calling of the disciples, and Jesus calming the storm. The 3rd and 4th grade students will continue their study on the life of Jesus with His clearing of the temple, His conversations with Nicodemus, His encounter with the Samaritan woman, and His rejection at Nazareth. The 5th grade students will begin a Lenten study which will continue through Passion Week.

Don't forget that Ash Wednesday is February 18. The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday, emphasizing human mortality ("remember you are dust") and the need for a Savior. This LCMS link is a wonderful article: <https://witness.lcms.org/2008/keeping-a-holy-lent-2-2008/>

March will start the Spring curriculum for all classes. Parents and Me Class will continue in God's Word with our youngest. Preschool and Kindergarten will cover the Good Samaritan, the widow's offering, the Last Supper, and the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The 1st and 2nd grade will experience Jesus calming a storm, His healing of a blind man, the Last Supper, and the denial of Jesus by the Apostle Peter. The 3rd and 4th grade will learn about some of the miracles of Jesus: His healing of the paralytic man, the healing of Jairus's daughter, His walking on water, and His entry into Jerusalem. The Fifth grade will continue their Lenten study.

Encourage your children to hide God's Word in their hearts through the memorization of scripture. *"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is a gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."* (Ephesians 2: 8-9).

CONCERTS AT PEACE PRESENTS - KAREN BLACK



Join us on Sunday, March 1, at 3:00PM when Dr. Karen Black will present an organ recital at Peace.

Dr. Karen Black is the Rudi Inselmann Endowed Professor of Organ at Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa. She teaches organ and church music, music theory and aural skills, serves as organist for weekday chapel and other worship services, and conducts the Kantorei choral ensemble and Handbell Choir. She holds the Bachelor of Music degree in church music from St. Olaf College, the Master of Music degree in organ and church music from Indiana University, and the Doctor of Music degree in organ performance and literature from Indiana University.

Dr. Black is active as a recitalist and clinician and has performed throughout the United States. She has performed organ recitals in Germany, including at the Castle Church in Wittenburg and St. George's Church in Eisenach. She has been heard on the nationally broadcast *Pipedreams* program. Her essay "J.S. Bach as Theologian-Musician" appears in *Together By Grace: Introducing the Lutherans* (Augsburg Fortress, 2016). She has published organ and choral arrangements with Augsburg Fortress and Morningstar Music, including a collection of organ hymn introductions, *Shine Like the Sun* (Augsburg Fortress, 2018). In 2021, she released an organ album, *Ein feste Burg*, on the ARSIS label, celebrating the 25th anniversary of the installation of the Wartburg College Chapel Dobson organ.

Black currently serves as President of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. She has served as North Central Regional Counselor of the American Guild of Organists and is an active member of the Organ Historical Society and America Choral Directors Association.

WHAT DID I JUST SING? A LOOK AT SOME IMAGES IN OUR HYMNS

Many of our hymns are straightforward in what they say and the images that they use. *Beautiful Savior*, for example, has very little in it that is hard to decipher. However, some of our hymns use phrases or references today that are, perhaps, less familiar to us in daily life. This series will explore some of these hymns.

The Sanctus - What's a Sabaoth?

On every weekend we participate in Christ's Supper, we sing the Sanctus just before the words of institution. The first line we sing is, "Holy, holy, holy Lord God of Sabaoth—Heaven and Earth are full of Thy glory!" What, exactly, is a "Sabaoth"?

Contrary to what I thought as a child, it is not a strange spelling of "sabbath" to add a syllable. This is an attribute of God that means something rather opposite of rest (which is what sabbath means). When we look at the context of this line of our hymn in Scripture, we find it is taken from Isaiah 6:3. There, Isaiah has received a vision from God in which God calls him to be His prophet to the people. In the vision, Isaiah sees God on His throne. Around that throne, there are seraphim (a type of angel) singing the line from our hymn.

The word "Sabaoth" is a Hebrew transliteration (exact same sound as the word in its original language). The term is based on "saba," which is the verb "to wage war," from which comes their nouns for war and for army. The fuller term used by the angels in our text is for the one who oversees these military hosts. So, rather than being about rest, we are using a military image of God as the general of the heavenly armies.

If we are joining with the angels in Heaven praising God as the general of the angels, then why do we sing about it right before the Lord's Supper? We do so for a couple of reasons. First, the God who is the Lord of Armies, mighty in battle, is the also the God of mercy and love who reconciles us to Himself. Second, in this hymn, this first line of praise is combined with the second line, the hosannas of Palm Sunday. The Almighty God has incarnated Himself to be one of us and is about to be with us, in True Body and True Blood. We welcome Him as He enters our midst like He entered into Jerusalem on that day millennia ago.

So, as we sing the **Sanctus** on Sundays, remember this reality: The General of the Heavenly Armies, who could destroy every army on the Earth with a word, is come to you in love for us Christians to eat and drink for forgiveness, life, and salvation. In this way, in the Eucharist we have Heaven on Earth.

LIFE MINISTRY – FIFTY YEARS



The celebration of Jack and June's fiftieth wedding anniversary was a simple but nice reception in their church's dining area. Family and friends reminisced over old photos and gave thanks to God for blessing them with a happy marriage.

The state of marriage has changed a lot over those past fifty years. Since 1970, the marriage rate has declined by sixty percent. In 1970, the marriage rate was at 76.5 percent. By 2023, this dwindled to 31.1 percent. Much of the decrease has been due to a huge decline in the black and Hispanic populations; the two groups experiencing the most poverty and crime. The absence of fathers in the home is directly correlated to poor outcomes for their children. Stable marriages are the foundation of a functional society.

Living together before marriage has sky-rocketed. In the early sixties, less than 3% of married couples had lived together prior to their marriage. By the early seventies, celebrities living together made this lifestyle trendy. Now, over 70% of couples co-habit before marriage. Young people think it's just normal. Why not just "test" the relationship first before making any kind of commitment? But the dirty little secret is that those who have not made a public commitment to marriage before living together actually have a 48% higher divorce rate. Many consider living together as just part of dating, with little thought about a long-term future. Those who co-habit more than once are the least likely to get married.

Marriage certainly loses its appeal for those coming from broken families. They have endured very personal pain as they watched their parents divorce and they want to avoid repeating that experience. Feminism has negatively shaped women's attitudes towards marriage. Careers have been glamorized while raising a family has been downplayed. Many young women prioritize establishing their career first before seriously considering marriage. Sadly, by the time they feel ready for marriage, they discover that it's very difficult to find someone who shares their values and would be a compatible partner. Pornography has also played a role. Many men who have spent hours indulging in this have distorted views of women and are not capable of having a healthy relationship. Understandably, many young women are scared of having a relationship with someone influenced by porn.

I took the opportunity to see the beautiful sanctuary of Jack and June's church. It had been a large Lutheran congregation in North County; but that was years ago. Sadly, the attendance has dwindled to less than 100 people per week. Part of this is due to the population shift to St. Charles County, but it's also due to the general decline in church attendance throughout our nation. That's the heart of the problem.

As our nation has turned its back on God, it has suffered devastating consequences: broken families, crime, and a coarsened view towards life. While people pursue self-centered lifestyles, they are left with only emptiness and despair. Pray for our friends and relatives to return to God.

Purchases fell short and outdated soda contributed to the loss of revenue making it impossible to continue with the rental agreement.

In order to provide beverages for our members and guests we are trying something new! A "Beverage Box" has been placed in the lower level hallway across from the elevator. This garage sale donated refrigerator is stocked with a variety of soda and water, Pepsi, and Coke products. It will function on the "honor system." All beverages are 50¢ each. A moneybox is located on the inside door; correct change is required.

This service will continue as long as the cost breaks even. With everyone's cooperation we can all enjoy cold beverages!!"

It was said that this would never work, we'd be broke before the year was out!

Fast Forward to Today - 2026

We have sold 29,030 cans/bottles of beverages in the 16 years! They still cost 50¢ and we are still in the black. Where else but church could an honor system work? Where else can you get a soda for 50¢? This is a break-even project, what profit has been made through the years went to purchase a rolling rack to store the beverages, and each year anything left over is donated to the "baby bottle" collection for the Pregnancy Center. Inflation is taking a toll, soda costs more water is less, but we hope to keep cost the same, it's just easy. So, enjoy a cold beverage and let others know where they are. And a big thank you to all for making this work.

The vase is a beautiful fluted 3" x 1" solid cast bronze vase featuring symmetrical etching and a drainage hole for proper water flow. In December 2025, the niche prices were increased to include the cost of the niche vase with each niche purchased. 




